Easter weekend event is Mar. 30, 31 and April 1

Painter David Palmer and functional art maker Jim Turner are among several Los Angeles-based artists juried into this year's roster of established and emerging artists at the 16th Annual Indian Wells Arts Festival in Indian Wells. Running Friday, March 30-Sunday, April 1, the event at Indian Wells Tennis Garden showcases 200 artists from 28 countries around the world.

Attendees will discover a diverse collection of mediums — from painting, mixed media, sculpture and photography to ceramics, textiles and jewelry. Sixty of the artists juried into the show have had their work exhibited by and/or placed into the permanent collections of museums, including the renowned Smithsonian and Japan's Kyoto Museum.

David Palmer's Suburban Retro Pop series celebrates pinwheel lollipops, donuts, movie popcorn boxes and other products of 20th century culture. His creative credentials include texture effects for films such as Spider-Man 3 and Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone and a coloring book derived from his paintings of carousel horses.

"I've always loved things that were industrial and vintage," says Jim Turner who builds functional art from discards in his Covina studio, Lockjaw Garage. For example, old cameras become intriguing lamps. Truck tailgates and old pallets make benches with rugged character.
